When we first moved to Lamar, I was in a conversation with a long time resident here in Lamar. I asked him, "So what is the Fall like around here?" His response? "Well, about 2 hours." I still chuckle when I think of that conversation.

Fall has some wonderful attributes: such as cooler weather and the changing of the colors. I think one of the things I like the most about Fall is that there is an intrinsic slowing down of things. Plants slow down. Squirrels start foraging so that they can slow down. And if it weren't humanity's drive to push themselves to their brink (and also for early Christmas sales and promotions), we'd probably slow down too. It just feels kind of natural to take a little slower pace on walks and read more books with a blanket and a cup of something warm to drink.

My Dad had a problem with Fall. His favorite season was Spring. He loved to see things come alive. His favorite color was green because of Spring. To him, Fall felt like a deathblow to Spring and Summer. He even preferred the searing heat of summer and the frigid winds of winter over Fall. "It's just like I'm witnessing the beginning of the end," he'd say. He didn't mind the changing colors. He just found the rest of it depressing.

My mom was an eternal optimist. Whatever the season was, she loved it. Her statement was, "Well, first of all, you can't change it so you might as well enjoy it, right?" And then she would go on to say something that has stuck with me ever since. "There would be no Spring without Fall. In fact, because we know God is faithful, in the midst of Fall, we can even celebrate Spring, because we know its coming, its just a matter of time." That didn't convince Dad, but it is something that has stuck with me—and not just with weather patterns and seasons.

Some could argue that our world seems to be entering into a season of Fall—and not necessarily in a good way. Things are changing colors in our world but not pretty yellows and oranges. The economy is struggling in many different ways. Prices are up and even with that, some things that were commonly obtained are now not available at all. Morality has become more based upon selfish desires rather than Godly principles. Peoples are resorting to name calling and violence to achieve their goals. In places like Israel and Gaza and Russia and the Ukraine, people are losing their lives and their ability to sustain their life. And why? Those in power are seeking more power at the expense of the innocents.

I'm reminded of CS Lewis' book in his Narnia series, The Silver Chair, where the Pevensie children (Peter, Susan, Edmond, and Lucy) realize that they have been away from Narnia for a long time and during that time, the trees no longer communicate and many of the animals have gone feral. The magic of the land has dissipated to the point in which a sort of Fall that leads to a brutal winter is nye upon the land. I think of that point in the book a lot when I look at the world around me.

But then, the Holy Spirit gently shakes me and reminds me of three wonderful truths:

- 1. Humanity has experienced worse in our history and God has faithfully carried us through then and will now as well. If one looks through human history and sees the brutality against Christians that the Roman Empire and the Ottoman Empire had, one can clearly see why Christianity is exploding in places like China and Iran. God didn't give up then. God won't give up now. God was not overwhelmed then. God is not overwhelmed now. Jeremiah wrote in Judah's darkest hour—as they were being dragged out of burning Jerusalem, "Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning. Great is Your faithfulness, O Lord!" (Lamentations 3:21-22)
- 2. Everything is going to work out for the good even when evil tries its very best. Even Satan has to get permission from Christ to do anything to us our around us. The tough stuff we face today or tomorrow? It has a God-ordained purpose to it. Hang in there. It will end up good one way or another. "All things work out for the good for those who love God and are called according to His purpose." (Romans 8:28) Even Job and all he went through would agree with that statement. He said, "I know that You [God] can do all things; no plan of Yours can be thwarted." (Job 42:2)

**3.** The presence of each Fall we experience means that the ultimate Spring yet to come. Paul wrote of this Spring in 2 Corinthians 4:17, "For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all." Paul tells us more in 1 Thessalonians 4. These are his words.

"According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever." (1Thess. 4:15-17)

Jesus also said, "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God, believe also in Me. In my Father's house are many mansions, if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if i go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you unto Myself; that where I am, there you may be also." (John 14:1-3)

Fall means spring is coming. In that, there can be great hope. In the words of Polycarp as he faced execution by burning at the stake, "Eighty-six years have I served him and He has done me no wrong..." God causes all things—even evil things—to have a meaningful, blessed end to those who love him and are called according to His purpose. God has a wonderful outcome planned. In that, regardless of what happens around us—there is hope instead of fear, joy instead of despair, and peace instead of worry. So enjoy the colors of the literal Fall season. Enjoy the cooler weather. Enjoy the hopefully slower pace. Enjoy the soups and sweaters and warm blankets. Enjoy the coffee, tea or hot chocolate. And when you see the plants that succumb to the colder weather and brown become the dominant color, remember there is a message in all of this.




